# Keswick Mouse Trail

You are about to embark on a challenge that will take you on a fun trail around our beautiful market town, Keswick. Gerald the Mouse and all his mischievous little friends that live in the Cheese Deli, like to play fun games. They are playing hide and seek in lots of different windows around the town. Can you find all 21 of them? Don't worry, your mission doesn't have to be completed in a day. Take your time and maybe call in to some of the lovely places along the way; there's lots to do. All the mice are ready and waiting for you to find them – good luck!

The Trail starts in a quaint, cobbled courtyard in Keswick, called Packhorse Court. Here you'll find mouse number 1 hiding in the Cheese Deli window. This is Gerald and it's where all the cheeky little mice live. They get up to all sorts of mischief in there. Sometimes however, they like to play hide and seek around the town.



Continue walking in the same direction. Don't forget to wave at the webcam on the side of the town hall; just above the iconic PUP's clock. Carry on walking past Museum Square until you see the tallest mountain of Kendal Mint Cake you ever did see. Mouse number 12 is peeping from one of these windows somewhere.

With your back to the Cheese Deli door, turn left and walk diagonally across the courtyard and through the covered walkway onto Station Street. At the end, turn right and follow the pavement as it bends round to the left on St John's Street. Look out for an orange café bar. There's definitely something strange about the shape of this fruit though! Can you see mouse number 2 peeping at you?

Carry on a little further up St John's Street until you see things from a different point of view. There are beautiful photographs of mountains and stunning Lakeland views in this window. Mouse number 3 will be waiting for you.

Further up this road is one of Keswick's real treasures. You can step back in time over 100 years in here, whilst you enjoy watching something very up to date. Mouse number 4 is hiding in this window.

Walk back into town and you'll see a very impressive building right in the centre of Main Street. This fabulous historical building has bars on some of the windows. What might it have been in the past? Can you find mischievous mouse number 5?

With your back to the main door of Moot Hall, walk diagonally right and onto Lake Road, following the bend in the road towards the lake. Continue down this road until you find a flower with quite an unusual twist. Mouse number 6 likes to climb up high.

Continue walking in the same direction and admire the lovely mural as you walk through the subway and enter Hope Park. Mouse number 7 might just be enjoying a delicious nibble to eat here!

Walk through Hope Park to the end. Take the opportunity to turn right as you leave the park and head to Derwent Water, to look at the breath-taking views in front of you. Head back towards Hope Park, but go straight past the gate you walked out of before. Look straight ahead for a large building at the other side of the car park. In front of you, is the home of our amazing local super heroes. Mouse number 8 is the largest one and he's always watching and ready to spring into action to help someone.

Re-trace your steps through Hope Park and up Lake Road. Walk down the left-hand side of Moot Hall. Watch out for a tall waterfall, but it's certainly not water that's falling! Look carefully in the window for Mouse number 9. Hopefully, he'll stay away from the waterfall!

With your back to mouse number 9, walk diagonally left across High Street until you see a friendly red insect. Mouse number 10 likes to look at twinkly objects. Can you spot him?

Carry on walking down High Street just a little further. Somebody is in the Lakes and so are lots of happy sheep. Mouse number 11 is waving from the window at you.

Carry on until you arrive at a mini roundabout. From here, you should be able to see a place that has many super treats for animals. Cross over the road at the crossing, as mouse number 13 is waiting for you to find him.

With your back to mouse number 13, turn left, then follow the left bend in the pavement. Just before Greta Bridge, look out for a man riding a bike, that's coming out of the wall! Mouse number 14 loves peeping from this window.

Re-trace your steps back to the PUP's clock. Use the pedestrian crossing to safely cross the road and walk up Bank Street until you find a shop with a very sheepish name. Here you'll find Mouse number 15 winking at you from the window.

Continue walking in the same direction, following the bend in the road until you come to Otley Road. Turn left here and look out for a very colourful door. This building looks out over the River Greta and Fitz Park. Mouse number 16 is a very creative mouse and likes watching from one of these windows.

Follow the road round a little further and this becomes Brewery Lane. The name of this lane gives a clue about where you can find mouse number 17. He likes to sit and watch from one of the highest windows.

Continue on Brewery Lane until you are back on the main road. Turn left and walk up to the crossing but then turn immediately left down Station Road, towards Fitz Park. Keep walking until you come to a building that has lots of very interesting and old artefacts. Mouse number 18 is hiding in one of these windows.

Walk back down Station Road and cross using the pedestrian crossing. Continue down Station Street, looking out for a place where you can buy delicious food to cook. Mouse number 19 is peeping out of this window.

With your back to mouse number 19, carefully cross the road and start to walk back through the covered walkway again, into Packhorse Court. When you're half way through the walkway, you might feel like you've reached Middle England. Mouse number 20 is difficult to find in the window of this wonderful Aladin's cave.

Continue down the covered walkway into Packhorse Court. At the bottom, walk diagonally right. There's a special place where everything is made out of wood. Hiding somewhere in this window, you'll find the last cheeky little mouse, number 21, waiting to be found.
